What I'm ultimately looking for are the records in question. I'm told that there's a lifetime retention requirement, and either the County must retain those records, or transfer them to the Archives. I simply refuse to believe the records don't exist. I believe that they exist, just simply aren't being provided to me, either deliberately or because someone is refusing to research their location thoroughly. The remedy I seek is securing those records, or identifying that they were actually destroyed prematurely. I don't have a definitive answer either way, and need guidance on the appropriate way to get that information.
