Dear State Records Committee (SRC),

The Utah Local Governments' Trust (ULGT) was established by certain municipalities and counties as an interlocal entity that would receive and administer millions of public tax dollars from the citizens of such municipalities and counties to pay claims based on malfeasance and/or misappropriation of such monies which can be brought against persons who have been elected or appointed as certain public officers of such municipalities and counties and have committed such crimes while performing the duties of such officers.

Albeit persons elected or appointed as certain public officers of certain municipalities are mandated by laws and ordinances to execute and file surety bonds which bind them to perform the duties of such officers without committing malfeasance and/or misappropriation of public tax dollars and to pay penal sums if they do commit such crimes, it appears that the UGLT is covering such persons with crime or theft insurance that precludes the ULGT from demanding indemnification or contributions from such persons if claims are brought against them for and they are found guilty of committing such crimes during their tenure as such officers.

Since August 2, 2018, I've requested to access and inspect certain administrative interlocal records of the ULGT. Although all my requests state I prefer digitized records and have been transmitted exclusively to the ULGT via the email address of its certified records officer and even though all my appeals have been transmitted exclusively to the Board or to its Chief Executive via their respective email addresses, the initial and appellate decisions with respect to my requests have been documented exclusively on paper and transmitted to me exclusively by the conventional services of the United States Postal Service. I will scan such decisions and share them all with the SRC in a subsequent email. I'm being compelled by the certified records officer of the ULGT to travel to the physical office of the ULGT to access and inspect paper versions of the records which I've requested. I find such actions to be very unusual in this day and age of paper reduction and electronic government.

The certified records officer of the ULGT has never explained to me that the ULGT does not digitize its records or that it digitizes them but will not provide them to me via its website or email. I'm being compelled to pay fees to access and inspect paper versions of such records without any citation of the ordinance or policy of the ULGT that authorizes such fees. Referring to <http://www.archives.utah.gov> and <http://www.utahtrust.gov>, I do not find any rules with respect to the management of, access to or inspection of the records of the ULGT.

Nearly all the other governmental entities which I request records from provide them to me digitized in accordance with my stated preference for such.

I believe that the ULGT is hindering and violating my rights to access and inspect its records which I've requested and I appeal such hindrance and violations. Accordingly, I hereby request that an appellate hearing before the SRC be expeditiously scheduled.
